The All Nations Healing Room

The All Nations Healing Room was designed, based on input from Elders in local First Nations communities, to provide a culturally safe, quiet and peaceful space within the Patient Care Centre that is welcoming and open to Indigenous peoples.

This room offers space where Indigenous patients can gather with family to perform traditional healing practices and ceremonies while in hospital, such as smudging, cleansing and singing.

The design of the space is inspired by a Coast Salish Longhouse. The welcoming figures, entrance doors and carvings hanging in the room were designed and created by Charles Elliott and Doug LaFortune. Also in the space is an original painting created for the All Nations Healing Room and donated by Métis artist Frank Lewis (1932 – 2013).

The All Nations Healing Room extends to the outdoors and includes beach log benches and a pond with a waterfall.

General Information

- All First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples are welcome in this space.
- The room is open 24 hours a day 7 days a week.
- If the room is locked please call Security at Ext. 18575 for assistance with unlocking the doors.
- All patients and families are invited to bring their own cultural ceremonial supplies.
- Please be mindful that a ceremony is in session if the "Ceremony In Progress" sign is displayed.
- This room is equipped with a special ventilation system that allows for ceremonies involving burning sage, sweet grass and candles to be safely practiced. Please follow the ventilation instructions posted inside the room.
- All Healthcare providers can assist patients to access the room.
