# There is more than one patient

with Gastroenteritis or Noro-Like Illness (NLI) and the ICP/EHO have not yet completed an investigation and risk assessment

Initiate ENHANCED MEASURES

Access Outbreak Playbook (Section 2)

#### Surveillance

- Monitor patients for acute on set of vomiting and/or diarrhea in health care workers and patients
- Assess patient symptoms twice daily and document
- New cases: notify the IPAC/EHO program immediately
- Obtain a stool or emesis specimen in a dry C&S container from each new symptomatic case

#### **Additional Precautions**

- Droplet and contact precautions for patients with symptoms (PCRA)<sup>2</sup>
- Encourage symptomatic patients to stay in room and avoid group activities
- Meals must be served to these residents in their rooms
- Patient admissions, transfers, and movement are not restricted

## Housekeeping

- Notify housekeeping of all patients on additional precautions
- Additional (Precaution Plus) cleaning will be ordered by ICP for rooms of patients on additional precautions and for common areas
- Refrigerators and food prep areas should be cleaned and disinfected

### Unit Lead/Designate

- Refer symptomatic staff to:
  - Island Health Staff: <u>Provincial Workplace Health</u> Contact Centre
  - Affiliate staff: Their family physician
- Continue to be vigilant for acute onset of vomiting and/or diarrhea in staff and patients.

IPAC/MM or EHO/MHO complete investigation and risk assessment:

Is an Outbreak Declaration required?

≥3 patients with
Gastroenteritis or NoroLike Illness (NLI)
Not attributed to noninfectious causes¹

Occurring within a 4-day period
Epidemiologically-linked (e.g., by room/floor/ common area/staff assignment)

<sup>2</sup> Maintain droplet and contact precautions until the patient is free of vomiting and/or diarrhea for at least 48 hours.

Symptom recurrence is common within 24-48 hours of initial GI symptom resolution. This is not a reinfection or new case.
